Create and Curate for Success: Designing Learner-Centred Pre-work



Pre-work is the first piece of our instructional design that students encounter and it can make or break a TBL module. Now that hybrid learning experiences are here to stay it is more important than ever to attend to this often overlooked / overloaded element of TBL to ensure that it meets the high standards of the rest of our learning and teaching material.

- Appraise and curate appropriate source material to provide your learners with compelling pre-work.
- Apply key principles of Multimedia Learning to evaluate original multimedia content and identify useful training materials for your learners to complete the preparation phase.
- Utilize a checklist to identify your pre-work assignments that meets learner, context and discipline requirements.
